## NLPA Annual Meeting Notes August 14, 2023

The meeting was called to order by Dan Kruse, President at 7:01 pm. Approximately 12 attendees.

#### Old Business:

- 1. Review 2022 NLPA Annual Meeting Notes: Sheryl Ulin summarized the notes from the 2022 NLPA Meeting
  - Motion to approve the 2022 NLPA Annual Meeting Notes: Tim Whitesall
  - Second: Don Zak
  - Approved by all present
  - Opposed by none
- 2. **Treasurer's Report:** Sheryl Ulin presented the Treasurer's Report. The June 30, 2023, balance on hand was \$11,690.35. See attached report.
  - Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report: Virginia Morgan
  - Second: Don Zak
  - Approved by all present
  - Opposed by none

#### 3. SAD Update

- Next 7 years of Special Assessment District was approved by both townships.
- Assessments did not change.
  - \$70 North Lake Farms
  - \$140 shared lake access
  - o \$220 water frontage
  - DNR Boat Launch \$650 / year
- Weed treatment costs increased.
- NLPA Board members met with Washtenaw County reps to discuss treatment and SAD finance allocations.
- Need to increase the assessments for future SADs

#### 4. Algae Blooms

- Algae Blooms and control of the blooms were discussed.
- Algae blooms are related to run-off from property around the lake.
- Natural vegetation at lake front can be used to keep the geese off the property.

#### 5. MICORP Update

- North Lake continues to participate in the CLMP
- Charlie Taylor assists with data collection. Data includes:
  - Secchi disc measurements of water clarity (weekly)

- Temperature and dissolved oxygen at 5-ft increments from surface to bottom
- Chloroophyll (monthly samples)
- Phosphorus (early spring and late fall)
- 12' Secchi disc reading this year. The depth reading has increased over the past 20 years.
- Dissolved oxygen and temperature profiles have stayed the same over the years.
- Very little ice coverage during the past winter. That may affect future data.

#### 6. Weed Treatment

- Report by Dave Pruess
- Lake looks great!
- Currently, Dave identified 3 patches of starry stonewart and charra (invasive)

#### 7. SAD Update – Lauren Koloski from Washtenaw County

- Encouraging rain gardens
- Free private consultations for rain gardens are available
- One weed treatment was done in 2023
- Possible second treatment
- No lily pad treatment in 2023
- No harvesting in 2023
- 2024 harvesting will be during the late summer
- Don: for harvesting to be effective you want to do it when the plant first emerges
- Weeds are managed for recreational use of the lake
- Harvesting is approximately \$1000/acre
- Lauren will talk to the consultants & harvester to see when harvesting should be done in 2024.

#### New Business

#### 1. Phosloc Treatment

- Goal was to use phosloc annually
- Too much money was spent in 2022 so we will not use phosloc in 2023.
- Dave Pruess is not convinced that phosloc treatment decreased algae bloom

#### 2. Contract with Kieser & Associates

- The County allowed an increase in the consulting contract
- Kieser & Associates bill was much greater in 2022 than previous years. Consequently, there are decreased funds available for weed treatment / management.

#### 3. SAD Budget

• County officials are now talking to NLPA Board to determine the budget and treatment plan

#### 4. Phosphorus Management

- Don Zak encouraged Outreach efforts by NLPA to decrease phosphorus in North Lake
- Consider other methods of community engagement such as: 1) Garden walk,
  2) Free plants 3) DNR professionals to discuss rain gardens and 4) Plant sale around Memorial Day
- Work to get the Landing Representatives engaged with NLPA and neighbors
- Increase communication
- Consider changing the date of the annual meeting to September

### 5. NLPA Dues

- Consider increasing dues in 2024.
- Consider placing a note in the 2024 Laker about the 501(c)(3) status of NLPA so homeowners consider contributing additional funds.
